## Helen's Special Carrot Cake

- 1 C Vegetable Oil
- 1 1/2 C Sugar
- 3 Eggs
- 2 C Flour
- 2 tsp. Baking Soda
- 2 tsp. Cinnamon
- 1 8oz can Crushed Pineapple
- 1 C Flaked Coconut
- 1 C Chopped Nuts
- 2 C Shredded Raw Carrots
- 1/2 tsp. Salt



Preheat oven to 350. Grease 9x13, bundt, or layer pans. Combine all ingredients and place in pan (s) and bake 30-35 minutes.

For frosting, mix following:

- 3 oz Cream Cheese
- 1/2 C Margarine
- 2 C Powdered Sugar
- 3 Drops Maple Flavoring
- 1 tsp. vanilla.

*Q. What should I do if I have a bee and/or hornet problem?*

A. We suggest you purchase a can of wasp and hornet killer to spray the nest with. The best time to do this is dusk or just after dark when all of the bees are home. The spray is very effective but make sure you and anyone that may be around are protected. If you are uncomfortable doing this yourself, consider calling an exterminator for assistance.
